AS is a form of inflammatory arthritis which mainly affects the spine, although other joints, tendons and organs (eyes, bowels, skin) may also be affected. Symptoms tend to start in late teens and early twenties with the average age of onset at 24 years of age. NASS works hard to support those living with the condition by providing a range of information and a helpline; campaigning for better services; supporting research into the condition and targeting healthcare professionals to reduce the current 8.5 year delay to diagnosis. NASS also has over 90 branches which provide regular, supervised exercise and hydrotherapy sessions for people with AS.
